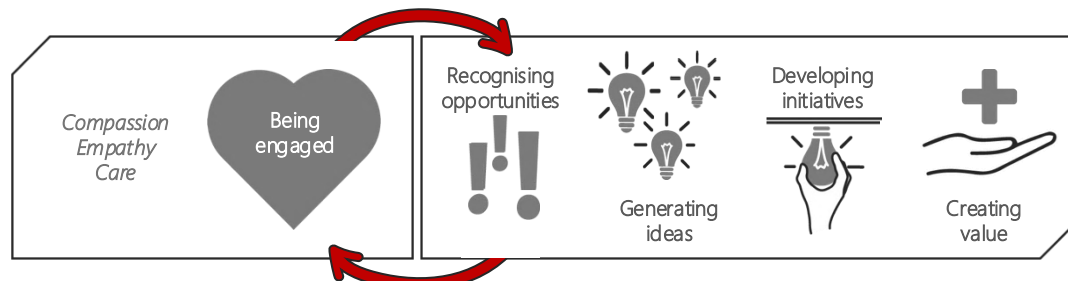

SUITABLE

- After completing a social entrepreneurship project.
- To learn lessons for the future.
- To learn to see/recognise/reinforce value.
- To decide whether the result has been achieved.

TIPS

- Make children explicitly aware of the difference they made.
- For 'sharing with others', think beyond school/parents, e.g. a report on local radio, an article in a local newspaper. Let the target audience have their say too. (see CLASS IN NEWSPAPER)

MATERIALS

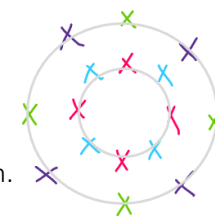
STEP 1

Look back on the challenge/situation that the class worked on.
(see STRIP / REVERSE PLANNING)

STEP 2

Let the children reflect on the results and the value created in small groups.

STEP 3

Let the children share their opinions with others according to the principle of the carousel discussion.

- Form an inner and an outer circle.
- Place children from the same group in the same circle, but make sure they are not standing next to each other.
- Let the children share their opinions. Give the inner circle a few minutes to speak, then the outer circle a few minutes.
- Have the children in the inner circle move one place so that they are facing the next children in the outer circle.
- Repeat this several times.

STEP 4

Discuss as a class whether:

- the challenge has been completed. → Celebrate this milestone with extra attention to sharing the results with others.
- further action is needed. → Take action or let the children think about how they can approach it next time to achieve the goal (even) better.

FINISH REACHED?

Context

Any activity or project.

STEP 1

Look back with the children.

- What is the challenge/situation we sought a solution for?
- What opportunities did we want to seize? What did we want to achieve?
- What ideas did we have for this?
- Which idea/initiative did we choose?
- How did the implementation go?

STEP 2

Let the children reflect on the results/value created in small groups.

- What have we achieved now?
- Who benefits from this? For whom does this mean something/a change/...?
- To what extent have we achieved the goal? Completely, almost completely, partially, a little?
How do you know?
- Are you satisfied with this?
- Do we need to take any additional action? Is there a previous idea that we haven't developed that could help us here?
- How can we bring the result to the attention of others (including outside the school)?

STEP 3

Let the children share their opinions with others according to the principle of the carousel discussion.

STEP 4

Discuss as a class whether:

- the challenge has been completed. → Celebrate this milestone with extra attention to sharing the results with others.
- further action is needed. → Take action.
